

<u>PART II – Summer School Course (February):</u> World History since 1900: Global and Regional Interactions, Grade 11 Open (CHT3O)

Students will sign up for the above course when the summer school course registration opens in the spring.

This course focuses on major developments in world history from 1900 to the present. Students will explore the causes/ consequences of global and regional conflicts, the impact of significant individuals and social movements, and the effects of social, economic, and political developments around the world. Students will extend their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking/ the historical inquiry process/ including the interpretation/ analysis of evidence, when investigating interactions within and between nations and other historical developments and events, including those that continue to affect people in various parts of the world.

<u>Prerequisite</u>: Canadian History since World War I, Grade 10, Academic or Applied, or the locally developed compulsory course (LDCC) in Canadian history.

<u>OVERVIEW</u>: The course has five strands. Instruction and learning related to the expectations in strand A are to be interwoven with instruction and learning related to expectations from the other four strands. Strand A must not be seen as independent of the other strands. Student achievement of the expectations in strand A is to be assessed and evaluated throughout the course.
