# **APA STYLE – 7<sup>th</sup> Ed. (American Psychological Association)**

\* Updated March 2021

### **General Rules:**

- Double space your reference list and paper
- Arrange your list on alphabetical order by the surname of the author OR the title of the book if there is no author
- Capitalize only the first letter of the first word in the title
- Italicise journal titles and volume numbers. Do not italicise issue numbers
- References cited in the text must appear in the reference list
- In your reference list, alphabetize the entry by title, ignoring A, An, or The

## **In-Text Citations and Signal Phrases:**

When information is quoted or referred to in a paper, an in-text citation is used to identify the source of the information or a signal phrase in place of a citation. In-text citations briefly identify the source and allow the reader to locate the full citation in your reference list (bibliography).

#### Example in-text citation:

During the turbulent 1960's, science fiction programs on television reflected the public's attitudes towards the older generation (Gibson &Roberts, 2008).

#### Example in-text citation with signal phrase:

**Gibson and Roberts in a 2008 study** discussed how, during the turbulent 1960's, science fiction programs on television reflected the public's attitudes toward the older generation.

#### Other Tips:

- When a work has no author, use the first two or three words of the works title as your text reference.
- Do not use quotation marks around a quote of more than 40 words, you must use a free-standing block quotation on a new line, indented five spaces and omit quotation marks.
- Quotations of less than 40 words should be incorporated in the text and enclosed with quotation marks.
